#### **Public Notice**

In response to the Coronavirus-19 awareness threat, The Town of Troutman's top priority is the health, safety and security of our community and employees. Town officials are taking the current spread of COVID-19 very seriously and receiving guidance from the Iredell County Health Department and other governmental partners in monitoring this situation. The Town Hall lobby is closed to the public, so we have implemented the following:

- All customers are encouraged to conduct utilities payments with the Town utilizing its online feature at <a href="www.troutmannc.gov">www.troutmannc.gov</a> (the \$3 online convenience fee has been removed for the next few months); or depositing your payment in our Town Hall utilities payment drop box located outside by the Town Hall Drive Up; or by calling the Town offices at 704 528-7600 and making your payment over the phone during business hours. - ♦ The playground, restrooms and water fountains at the Troutman ESC Park are closed until further notice. Please enjoy the open field areas and walking trails in the park.
- Public Works department asks that we "think before we flush". If the toilet paper shortage has you using disposable wipes, paper towels, tissues, etc.—Please put them in the garbage can. Even if the label says "flushable", these items can clog our sewer lines. Use the trash can, not the toilet!

# Bicycle Laws & Safety>>>

With Spring on the horizon and more cyclists likely to be on the road, it's important to remember that safety is a shared responsibility between motorists and cyclists. Both motor vehicles and bicycles are subject to North Carolina traffic laws.



According to the North Carolina Department of Transportation, bicyclists must ride in the same direction of traffic and obey all traffic signs and signals, stopping at red lights and stop signs. Additionally, cyclists should keep to the right side of the road, designated for slower traffic, and use hand signals to indicate turns. At night, bicyclists are required to use a front lamp and a rear reflector (or reflective clothing), both of which must be visible from a distance of 300 feet

Motorists should be prepared for bicyclists to take the whole lane, as it is permitted by law for cyclists to do. Motor vehicle drivers must allow at least 2 feet of space when passing a bicyclist; motor vehicle drivers may cross a double yellow line to pass a bicyclist as long as: (1) there is enough sight distance to do so; and (2) the motorist allows at least 4 feet of space between the motor vehicle and the bicyclist OR moves completely into the opposite lane to pass. Drivers should also always look for bicyclists before turning, backing up, and when driving at night. Pass bicyclists only when it is safe to do so, and be sure to give them plenty of room.

# Essential Single-Family Rehabilitation (ESFR) Program Available to Eligible Homeowners >>>

Iredell County has been awarded funding from the North Carolina Housing Finance Agency to rehabilitate eligible homes. The primary goal is to encourage the essential rehabilitation of single-family homes owned/ occupied by lower-income households with: an elderly and/or disabled fulltime household member; with a child under the age of 6 whose health is threatened by the presence of lead-based paint hazards; and/or veteran households with incomes at or below eighty percent (80%) of the area median income.

The amount of funds available can vary from \$5,000 to \$25,000, depending on the condition of the home. Manufactured Homes are eligible if the foundation and utility hookups are permanently affixed, included removal of all transporting equipment and installation of a full masonry foundation and tie-downs. The property must be current with all taxes. ESFR assistance will be provided to eligible owner-occupants in the form of interest-free, forgivable loans covering the costs associated with rehabilitation of the unit.
