Collection Guidelines

- ♦ Leaf and Limb services are for customers inside town limits.
- Limbs will not be picked up if they have been cut by professional cutters or trimmers.
- Please take your leaves and limbs to the curb in front of your house the day before the first collection day. If it is not out before the crew comes through, then it will not be picked up.
- Please put your leaves and limbs in separate piles.
- Only limbs (under 4 inches in diameter) will be collected.
- ♦ Christmas trees will be collected with January LIMB Collection
- ♦ DO NOT put your leaves or limbs in bags

When town staffing availability is low, church volunteers even offer to completely handle an event for the town.


Town staff also enjoys the encouraging messages that members send, expressing their appreciation for their services. "We appreciate this church and all that it does for the community and the citizens of Troutman."





