Public Works—Sewer Line Jetting

In efforts to maintain and provide a clean sustainable community the Town of Troutman Public Works Department works very hard to insure our sewer system is maintained. July is when the Public Works Department sets time aside to perform these tasks. The procedures used are described below.



Sewer Line Jetting

A state compliance requirement for all sewer system operations is to

have an active sewer cleaning program. A sewer cleaning program ensures at least 10% of the total gravity sewer lines within the system are cleaned annually and takes a proactive approach to reduce sewer backups and protect the environment and community. A common technique utilized by municipalities to ensure pipeline maintenance is sewer jetting. This application involves jetting or flushing out the pipelines with pressurized water to push clogs and debris further down or out of the line. This type of maintenance keeps lines clear and flowing smoothly, mitigating the risk of a significant clog occurring. The ability to actively clean sewer lines ensures we continue with our high standard of state compliance records and, in turn, prevents spills that could result in state compliance violations and possible penalties.

As always, do not hesitate to contact us with any issues related to water, sewer, streets, & grounds. If you encounter a water or sewer emergency after hours, we are available 24/7 with our emergency call back program (704-682-3835).


