Who to Call About the Road?

You notice a pothole in the road. Day after day you do your best to avoid it but eventually it is time for the thing to be repaired, but who should you call for the repair? There are three entities that could be responsible for maintenance of the roadways; NCDOT, Town of Troutman, and the third is a private road where maintenance is the responsibility of property owners living on that roadway. It is important to know that North Carolina counties do not maintain roadways so there are no county roads in Iredell County.

How do you know who to call? Always feel free to check with Troutman staff but here are a couple of hints on who to call:

Most major roadways that serve multiple jurisdictions will be maintained by NCDOT.

-Most roadways that have centerline striping are NCDOT maintained roadways, a good example of this is Eastway Drive. The southern portion of Eastway Drive is maintained by NCDOT and is striped down the center, while the norther portion from Rumple Street to Old Murdock Road is maintained by Troutman and not striped.

-Most local roads that serve neighborhoods are maintained by Troutman

With new neighborhoods under construction the roads will eventually be maintained by Troutman. Once the neighborhoods are close to build-out it is the responsibility of the developer to bring the roadway up to Town standards and apply the final layer of asphalt prior to Troutman taking over maintenance. Troutman will not take over a roadway until a comprehensive final inspection is done to ensure the quality of the roadway. If a final layer of asphalt has not been applied, you should contact the neighborhood developer for any issues on a particular roadway. The Town holds bonds provided by the developer to complete the work in case unforeseen circumstances arise, and work

If you have any questions regarding the responsibilities of maintenance of a roadway please contact the Planning or Public Works Departments.

Town of Troutman: Code of Ordinances

No person shall stop, stand or park a motor vehicle, tractor-trailer, commercial vehicle, recreation type vehicle including motor homes or detached trailer, except when necessary to avoid conflict with other traffic or in compliance with the directions of a law enforcement officer or a traffic-control device in any of the following places:

In front or across the street of a public or private driveway

- Within 30 feet upon the approach to any flashing beacon, stop sign or traffic-control
- signal located at the side of a street or roadway
- Within the circular portion of any cul-de-sac
- In, or on the space between a sidewalk and a public street
