Medicine Drop Box


Troutman Police Department has a permanently installed prescription disposal drop box located in the lobby of Troutman Town Hall. The box can be access during Town Hall business hours: Monday - Friday; 8:00 am –5:00 pm.

Project Lazarus of Wilkes County provided the free drop box in order to help reduce drug addiction in North Carolina. This box allows individuals to safely dispose of unused medication without fear of it falling into the wrong hands or being stolen. The area is under video surveillance, but no records are kept and all deposits are anonymous.

Troutman Ordinances

<u>Dog Leash</u>: Our Town leash ordinance requires that your dog must be on a leash at all times when on public property within town limits. The intent of this ordinance is to protect the health and safety of the public and to protect your pet. The only area where dogs are allowed to run at large is at the town's off leash dog park within Troutman ESC Park (338 North Avenue).

<u>Dog Waste</u>: This is a friendly reminder to be respectful and please clean up after your pet. Dog waste is more than just smelly and messy, it's also a breeding ground for infection and public health concerns as bacteria and parasites thrive in dog waste until cleaned. Our local pet ordinance requires that pet owners properly dispose of pet droppings, and neglecting to do so can result in fines. Troutman Police Department Blood Drive


The Troutman Police department's first Red Cross Blood Drive on Thursday, 18 February 2021 was a huge success despite undesirable weather. The very cold temperatures and rainy conditions could not keep the citizens and employees of Troutman from coming out and donating. We had 30 individuals attend and were able to collect 27 units of blood. These units will be used to help individuals suffering from accidents, surgeries, organ transplants and for those battling cancer. All blood donations are currently being tested for COVID-19 antibodies and can help current coronavirus patients battling the virus. There are positive results for the donor in addition to those who receive the blood. Some donor benefits include lowering risk of getting cancer, lowering risk of a heart attack, sustains a healthy liver, renews an individual's blood supply, reduces iron storage, burns calories, improves insulin sensitivity and lengthens an individual's life. The greatest benefit is the potential of saving a life. Thank you to all the Troutman citizens and employees that came out to donate.
