Troutman Planning Dept: Who Maintains My Street?

Who Maintains My Street?

The state (NC Dept of Transportation) owns and maintains many of the roads in Troutman; others are maintained by the Town, and some are privately owned and maintained. So how can you tell the difference?

Any road that is numbered with an 'SR' or contains a federal or State of North Carolina shield is not maintained by the Town. This information will be displayed on the street or highway sign for any given roadway. Another good rule of thumb to tell the difference is usually roads that are striped down the center are maintained by NCDOT and carry most of our traffic. A few examples of state-maintained streets are Main Street (Highway 21), Flower House Loop, Old Murdock Rd, Murdock Rd, Wagner St, Perth Rd, Autumn Leaf Rd, Oswalt Amity Rd, and Houston Rd to name a few.

The town typically maintains less traveled side streets and newly created streets associated with the development of residential subdivisions such as, but not limited to, Crosstie Lane, Downing Street, Georgie Street, and Patterson Street.

Improvements (and decisions to make improvements) to state-maintained roads are done by the North Carolina Department of Transportation, leaving the town at the mercy of the state when improvements are needed.

If you have questions about who maintains a particular street you can start by visiting NCDOT's website at ncdot.com. A mapping application has been provided that allows you to navigate to locate a specific street, or search by street name. You can also reach out to the Troutman Planning Department for information at 704-528-7600.
