### Troutman Planning Dept: Mobility Plan

The Town of Troutman was awarded a grant from the Charlotte Regional Transportation Planning Organization (CRTPO) to fund 80% of a new mobility plan for the town. The mobility plan will replace the existing Troutman Comprehensive Transportation Plan that was adopted in 2009.

Population and traffic count projections have been exceeded in the current plan, making the document obsolete. The new mobility plan will focus on improving existing roadway systems and identifying secondary roadway alternatives to alleviate congestion where needed. The plan will also incorporate findings and recommendations from the ongoing Bicycle and Pedestrian Plan and will also look into alternate modes of transportation such as transit, rideshares, and autonomous vehicles.

Another important aspect of the plan is guidance on alternate funding methods in order to implement the improvements suggested, as state money for transportation projects is limited. The Town will accept proposals for interested consultants up until May 9<sup>th</sup> and will begin the process reviewing the proposals with the intention to select the most qualified consultant at that time. The process is scheduled to be roughly a year in length and will involve input from the citizens throughout its development.

## POLICE WEEK 2022 MAY 11-17



In 1962, President John F. Kennedy declared May 15<sup>th</sup> as National Peace Officer's Memorial Day and the calendar week in which it falls as National Police Week. This was established by a joint resolution of Congress in 1962 and is a time when special recognition is given to those law enforcement officers who have lost their lives in the line of duty for the safety and protection of others. Over 22,000 officers have made the ultimate sacrifice in the United States since 1786.

The Troutman Police Department thanks all of these officers, but especially our own, Patrolman William John Pettit Sr. Officer Pettit lost his life as the result of a vehicle crash while responding to a vehicle pursuit to assist another agency on December 2, 1990 at 3:20 am. The Troutman Police Department will never forget his sacrifice.
