Hwy 21/Main St. Traffic Concerns

What's Happening with the Widening of Main Street/US 21/NC115

In an attempt to alleviate traffic issues, the North Carolina Department of Transportation (NCDOT) has plans to widen S. Main St through downtown Troutman. The original plan was for this widening project to begin in 2023; however due to budget deficits at the Department of Transportation, it has been pushed back and will not begin until 2029.

Main Street is a state owned and maintained road where all funding and planned improvements come from the State of North Carolina. We understand that traffic is a concern and improvements are needed on many of the state owned and maintained roads in our jurisdiction. The Town of Troutman is working with NCDOT to ensure that this project stays on track and continues to remain a priority.

It is our goal to continue to advocate for our roadways and keep our citizens informed about any planned improvements and their status. Monthly Police Beat: Travel Prep

Prep the Car in Advance

Avoid potential car problems that might involve unintended contact with others along the way by having your car fully serviced before your trip—at minimum check oil, fluids, breaks, tires, and antifreeze.

For any road trip, pandemic or not, the Federal Emergency Management Agency recommends prepping a car emergency kit that includes jumper cables, flares or reflective triangle, an ice scraper, blankets, maps, and cat litter or sand in case you need something for better tire traction.

Pack several back-up phone chargers, and just in case you lose cell service in some remote area, download your main maps to your phone or GPS.
