think there are any issues with tree limbs in your neighborhood on the primary line. Per them, the homeowner is responsible for other vegetation and growth. As far as telephone and cable lines, both AT&T and Spectrum said that it is homeowner's responsibility, and they will not trim for these lines. This is the time of year that you consider pruning trees and limbs so there is no loss of services with wind or ice issues.

Public Works: Lead and Copper Testing

Overview

September was another busy month for Public Works. This month multiple tasks are due for completion, including our lead and copper testing program.

What is the lead and copper testing program?

The Lead and Copper testing program's main objective is to protect the public from contaminants resulting from corrosion in the piping system. The program requires the water served by all community and no transient non-community public water systems to meet the safe level for lead and copper as measured in the selected areas; to provide optimal corrosion control treatment to minimize these corrosion by-products within the distribution system. The Town of Troutman has consistently achieved a high water quality standard, providing its customers with a safe, healthy product. We expect that to continue through this current round of testing.

As always, do not hesitate to contact us with any issues related to water, sewer, streets, and grounds. If you encounter a water or sewer emergency after hours, we are available 24/7 with our emergency call back program (704-682-3835).
