Water Policy #29: Payment Extensions

Final Notice of Existing Water Policy #29 regarding payment extensions will be adhered to immediately!

Payment Extensions: Extensions will only be granted under extreme circumstances. Extensions must be approved by the Town Manager or designee and will not be granted in excess of two (2) months in a twelve-month cycle. Once a customer is sent a disconnection notice, they are required to pay their bill in full. If they want to pay a portion of their bill, we will accept the portion; however the customer will remain on the disconnection list and will have their service turned off unless the remainder of their bill is paid on the disconnection date. Extensions must be requested before the disconnection date of the 25th of the month. Extensions will not extend more than five (5) days past the 25th of the month.
