Planning Dept: Who to Call About Mud

Sediment is the largest water pollutant in North Carolina. With the clearing of land and grading of property for development, construction sites are often left without ground cover for periods of time. Unfortunately, when weather patterns produce precipitation, a construction site can become a muddy mess causing sediment to leave the boundaries of the site. Whether by construction vehicle or the topography of the property, the mud can become a burden on adjacent lands. So who should you contact if you notice this happening? If you are noticing sediment being tracked on a road within the town limits, Ordinance Section 150.02 allows the town to enforce the contractor at the site in question to clean up the roadway. You can contact Code Enforcement to start the cleanup process. If sediment is leaving a site, contact Iredell County Erosion Control at 704-878-3118. Iredell County Erosion Control requires all development that grades over an acre of land for development, or ½-acre of land in a water supply watershed, to obtain an Erosion Control Permit. The permit requires a plan to be submitted showing measures to prevent sediment from leaving the site such as graveled construction entrances, silt fencing, rip rap, and stone filled outlets. These sites are inspected by Erosion Control Inspectors regularly to insure the measures are maintained and working in proper order. If you have any questions on who to contact regarding sediment feel free to call the Planning Department and they will be happy to get you in touch with the correct entity to help with the matter.

"From the Duck Blind ..." Manager's Memo

The staff and I receive many questions and comments about what we should be doing with and at the Iredell County Fairgrounds. To be clear, the Iredell County Fairgrounds property is within the town limits of Troutman. But it is owned and operated by Iredell County. The county did have a fairgrounds committee to plan and design what an event center with many opportunities would look like. Mayor Teross Young is the voice for Troutman on that committee. I serve as an alternate. The committee has two county commissioners from Iredell County. NC Representative Jeff McNeely and Senator Vickie Sawyer also serve on the committee. The rest of the committee is comprised of various staff from Iredell County. At this point, the State of North Carolina has given 10 (ten) million dollars to redesign and improve the Fairgrounds into a regional event center that should benefit the community and draw lots of people to our area to spend money and stay in hotels. Iredell County has pledged 6 (six) million of its own money. Approximately seven years ago, Troutman Town Council appeared before the Iredell County Commission and asked that the Fairgrounds (redesigned event center) remain in the town limits. The

county has recently announced plans for a first phase to be built using 16 (sixteen) million dollars. There has been no discussion of phases or what that entails with Troutman elected officials or staff. No plans have been submitted to Troutman for approval. Every one of us pays county taxes. Your voices on this topic should be shared with both Iredell County and Town of Troutman officials.

The Statesville Kiwanis Club will host the annual Fair from August 30th through September 7th. I hope you will be able to attend.

September 17th is Constitution Day. Did you realize 70 delegates could have signed for our independence from Great Britain? Of those, only 55 attended the meeting for discussion, and only 39 signed. And we think we have political disagreements now—our

independence as a nation and only a slim majority agreed to move forward. I am so thankful for those 39.
