Holiday Reminders: Garbage and Recycle

With the holidays approaching, we would like to send out a reminder regarding Waste Pro garbage and recycle pickup. No items outside the bins will be collected except on the following next pickup after New Year's Day.



Pick-up after New Year's Day guidelines:

- All items must be put in a 30-gallon trash bag. No items outside the bags will be picked up.
- Each service address is allowed no more than three (3) 30-gallon bags.

Also, during limb pickup on January 6, 7 and 8 in town residents that receive limb pickup may place their real Christmas tree(s) at curb for pickup. This is the only time Christmas trees will be picked up for disposal.

Hello, friends and neighbors. I hope you and your families had a merry Christmas and that the new year is more prosperous than the last. I appreciate all the staff's hard work putting out and putting up all the decorations. Unfortunately, it will take just as long to take them down and store them until next season. It also appears the Elf on the Shelf, the week before Christmas, was a huge success not only for the kids but also for adults. We had people driving from other counties trying to find the elf.

We have several boards that need volunteers. If you are a Town citizen or if you live in the extraterritorial jurisdiction (ETJ), we encourage you to consider serving the town in one of these positions. The county commissioners decide on the ETJ persons. They should spend the time vetting each person and selecting a qualified individual for ETJ representation. Being a part of the process helps our Town. We have a better chance of improving our quality of life by having a respectful and truthful debate.

One topic being discussed on January 13th is whether to have a social district in town. This would allow people to be outside in specific business areas with alcohol, within rules. All of you are welcome to come and state your opinion. You do not have to be on a particular board to have your voice heard. Town Council members, Town staff, business owners, and citizens will be on the committee to consider. They will do fact-finding and then make a recommendation later to the Town Council. This is the first meeting to begin the process.
